The International Alumni Association, open to all graduates, supports the growth of the Mini-School and offers members additional learning opportunities, such as the annual Alumni Kallah.

Curriculum

The core curriculum is a commitment of 28 sessions per year for two years. Classes are held once a week and last 2-1/2 hours.

Year One

Rhythms of Jewish Living introduces students to the ideas, beliefs and practices that shape a Jewish life.

Purposes of Jewish Living provides an overview of the theological foundations of Jewish life and religious practice.

Year Two

Dramas of Jewish Living Throughout the Ages is an exploration of specific dramatic events, experiences and issues from different periods of Jewish history.

Ethics of Jewish Living examines Jewish ethical issues, using case studies from Talmudic, rabbinic and contemporary literature.
